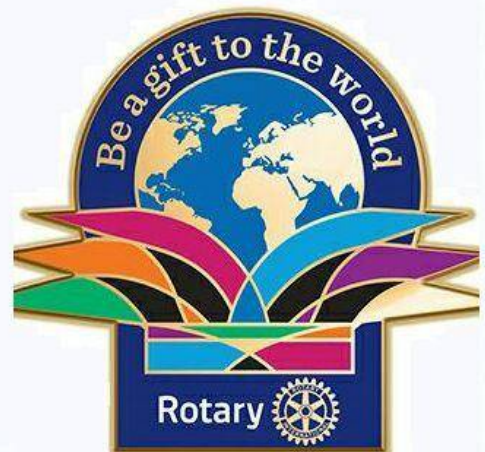

RCBS –Kajang Prison Medical Camp



The Rotary Club of Bandar Sunway carried out the 11th installment of the Kajang Prison Medical Camp on Sunday, 5th July 2015. The medical camp was attended by 9 club members and saw 30 juvenile inmates treated for scabies.

In recent years, the club has witnessed the dramatic decline in the number of inmates treated for scabies from a high of 180 patients when the project first started to a low of 30 patients this year. The smaller number of patients can be attributed to the improved living conditions and personal hygiene of the inmates. Our club's initiative over the years to create an awareness on the importance of personal hygiene and treatment method of scabies has in some small way contributed to the positive results.

Apart from carrying out the medical camp, RCBS donated cordial concentrate and soap bars to the 300 odd juvenile inmates at Kajang prison. This was made possible owing to the generosity of PP Ravee who eagerly came forward to sponsor the said items. PP Dr. Arasu as in past years, sponsored the medication and provided the medical treatment to the inmates. The medical camp would not have been made possible if not for the support and encouragement of President Arjan and the efforts of the project Organising Chair, CP Richard who has been the club's liaison with the prison authorities these past years.

RC Bandar Sunway's involvement with Kajang prison commenced in the year 2005. The suggestion to sponsor Coca-Cola to the inmates was mooted by Mr. James Nayagam when he was invited to speak at a club meeting. Mr. James is the founder and administrator of Shelter Home. CP Richard Ernest took up the suggestion and together with the support of the club sponsored a generous amount of carbonated drinks. The following year, with the help of then club member, Dr. Prasana, RCBS initiated the medical camp which has continued since under the guidance of Dr. Arasu. In past years, RCBS sponsored a playground for children of visiting families. The playground is frequented and very popular with the visiting children as seen in the photos shared in our club's Whatsapp chat group. Another initiative of our club in past years was the donation of books and learning material. The club's efforts eventually led to the setting up of Sekolah Integriti by the prison board.

In conclusion, special mention must be made of CP Richard Ernest who has spearheaded the club's initiatives and collaboration with Kajang Prison since 2005.

PROMOTE YOUR CLUB THROUGH A SIGNATURE EVENT

What you need to know to apply for a global grant using cash contributions



Identify. Decide on a public event and its purpose, such as to raise funds for The Rotary Foundation or to involve members of the community in a local project.



Publicize. Include your Rotary club name or district number in

the name of the event, following the guidelines in the Voice and Visual Identity Guidelines available in the **Brand Center**. Use social media and press releases to publicize your event and the work of Rotary and to build interest.



Connect. Assign club members to answer questions about the club and its projects during the event, to form connections with members of the public. Distribute information, such as What's Rotary? cards, pamphlets, and business cards linking to your club's website. Check out the Brand Center and shop.rotary.org for ideas and materials.



Repeat. Hold the event annually to build recognition. As awareness grows, more community members will participate and the event will become increasingly successful. You may even attract new members to your club.

On 1 July 2015, small changes to the way The Rotary Foundation is funded will strengthen our ability to support large-scale sustainable projects, ensuring that the Foundation doesn't have to use the World Fund to cover operating expenses.

The Foundation funding model is summarized in this guide, which tells you what you need to know to carry out global grant projects.

It is important to note that there is no change related to District Designated Funds.

Here are important details to keep in mind

According to Bill Pollard, a member of the Churchland Portsmouth club, thousands of people attend, netting about \$15,000 for each club to support local projects and programs.

"If you live in the Portsmouth area, you know it as the Rotary barbecue," Pollard says. "The two clubs have been working together on it for years. It's been a great way to promote Rotary."

Many Rotary clubs are known in their communities for one big project or event that sets them apart from other groups. Whether it's an annual dinner that raises funds for polio eradication or a park cleanup, these signature events promote Rotary's image as an action-oriented organization.

In Lima, Peru, the signature event for District 4455 is the Happiness Caravan, according to Ernesto Carlin Sotomayor and Julia Gereda de Carlin, who have both served as the district's governor. Rotary members work alongside the district's Rotaractors to escort more than 350 poor and elderly residents from all over the city in a caravan of buses to a rented facility, where they are treated to a full day of pampering: manicures, makeovers, medical care, meals, and fellowship.

The event, which started with 50 senior citizens, is now recognized by city leaders, who help identify beneficiaries.

While several small projects might not leave a mark, one larger project can become a signature.
