The Gift of Sight—Australia's Rotarians restore eyesight

Thanks to Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS), eye camps organised by the Rotary Club of Hetauda, Nepal, and funded by Rotary in Tasmania, are restoring sight to thousands of impoverished Nepali villagers.



In 2010 Rotary in Tasmania raised \$7000 through Rotary Foundation District Grants and club donations to fund an eye camp organised by the Rotary Club of Hetauda, Nepal. The camp was part of the Tilganga Eye Hospital outreach program and the eye specialists were trained by Dr Ruit, a close friend and colleague of Fred Hollows. Six Rotarians from Tasmania travelled to Nepal at their own expense to attend the camp and witnessed the life-changing impact it had on the people receiving treatment. They determined to continue their support

for the eye camps and Rotary in Tasmanian has since funded nine in total.

The eye camp screening sites are set up in remote areas of rural Nepal, many hours drive from the Community Eye Hospital in Hetauda. Villagers walk for up to five hours to attend - those unable to walk independently are often carried. Since the first camp in February 2011, 7800 Nepali people have had their eyes screened. Hundreds of easily treated infections that can cause permanent vision loss have been treated and 1450 sight restoring cataract surgeries have been performed. Over 50 Tasmanian Rotary members have attended the clinics and seen first-hand the enormous difference these simple treatments make to people's quality of life and ability to participate in and be valuable members of their communities. Through Foundation Global Grants a \$60,000 laser machine was made available to the Hetauda Community Eye Hospital to repair retinas, journey to Kathmandu.

Ian H.S. Riseley, of the Rotary Club of Sandringham, Victoria, Australia, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in 2017-18. He will become the president-nominee on 1 October if no other candidates challenge him.

Riseley says that meaningful partnerships with corporations and other organizations are crucial to Rotary's future.

"We have the programs and personnel and others have available resources," says Riseley. "Doing good in the world is everyone's goal. We must learn from the experience of the polio eradication program to maximize our public awareness exposure for future partnerships."

Riseley is a practicing accountant and principal of Ian Riseley and Co., which specializes in advising local and international businesses, and has a strong interest in international affairs. He received the AusAID Peacebuilder Award from the Australian government in 2002 in recognition of his work in Timor-Leste. He also received the Order of Australia medal in 2006 for service to the Australian community.

"Governments see Rotary as positive representatives of a civil society," he says. "We should work with them to advocate for peace and conflict resolution, just as we are advocating for polio eradication."

A member since 1978, Riseley has served Rotary as treasurer, director, trustee, RI Board Executive Committee member, task force member, committee member and chair, and district governor.

He is also a former member of the Australian Polio Eradication Private Sector Campaign and a recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Service Award for a Polio-Free World. He and his wife, Juliet, are Multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Major Donors, and Bequest Society members.
